
















Today's tour started with a boat ride through Tonglass Narrows






On the way, we passed a colony of "Harbor seals"





We arrived at Annette Island where our guide showed us a Starfish and a crab on the beach and a Banana slug and Bald eagle nest in the rainforest. . .





On our way back on the boat we saw a bald eagle in a tree on the shore.












Skagway's most famous craveyard is the Gold Rush Cemetery. Records indicate that the first burist occurred here early in 1886. With the exception of two farmilies, the centerery was no longer used after 1909. One bunded and thirty-three gravestee have been located here, but burial records are available for only usity of these.

Then to train car 348 from Skagway, Alaska to Fraser, British Colombia






Views from the famous White Pass & Yukon Route Train. You could easily imagine back in time how the anxious miners felt travelling along this railway to their destinations in the Klondike.






The train climbed almost 3000 feet up the steep hills and through long tunnels in the beautiful White Pass.












The bus took us along the magnificent Klondike Highway, via the American border station . . .






... and back to Skagway, Alaska. Later that evening, our ship sails from Skagway and Alaska for this time.
